Election Funds Management Overview



EFM Core Functions

- Perform quality assurance reviews and monitor program compliance
- Verify and approve funding requests from subrecipients, such as counties and county chairs
- Process revenue for the Elections Division
- Prepare applications for federal grants
- Provide technical assistance
- Prepare reports (state legislature, federal government, and other stakeholders)

General Prohibitions

- Activities the county is required to perform by law, e.g., early voting for the primary
- Day-to-day operating expenses that should be budgeted for by the county, i.e., no supplanting local funds with state funds
- Alcoholic beverages, gratuities and tips, and/or any food or drinks other than for a trip
- Activities to promote a particular party, candidate, or issue


EMR.SOS.TEXAS.GOV


