Weekly Updates From the Secretary of State September 18, 2024

Review of Personal Identification Numbers

- Sections 84.002 and 86.002 of the Election Code provide that an applicant or voter may include:
 - the last four digits of their social security number if the voter has not been issued a number by Department of Public Safety (DPS)
- However, voter may include either or both numbers on an ABBM or returned carrier envelope.

Review of Personal Identification Numbers

- There is no hierarchy or preferred number that a voter must provide if voter registration record contains both a number issued by DPS and the last four digits of the voter's social security number.
- Once the voter's identity has been verified, the ABBM or carrier envelope should continue through the review process.

FPCA Deadline

- Ballots to military and overseas voters using the Federal Postcard Application ("FPCA") must be mailed no later than Saturday, September 21, 2024.
- Use emergency ballots if necessary

Voting System Updates

- Voting system equipment is certified based on specific software and hardware versions
- Updates to voting system equipment (including Microsoft patches) require testing, review, and certification by the EAC at the federal level and by SOS at the state level
- Before a voting system may be updated to a new version or to incorporate an approved modification, you must seek written approval for the update from SOS
- Voting system equipment is used in a different manner from other traditional computer systems and are subject to greater protections that prevent unauthorized access to the system
 - Voting systems are never connected to the internet
 - State law requires counties to follow specific procedures that safeguard the equipment against physical access to the equipment by unauthorized users

Notice of Voter Eligibility

To be eligible to vote in the State of Texas, you must be a qualified voter of this state.

A qualified voter is a person who:

- Is a United States Citizen;
- Is 18 years of age or older;
- Is a resident of the State of Texas;
- . Is a registered voter of the State of Texas;
- Has not been finally convicted of a felony, or if so convicted has fully discharged the person's sentence, including any term of incarceration, parole or supervision, or completed a period of probation ordered by any court; or has been pardoned or otherwise released from the resulting disability to vote; and
- Has not been determined by a final judgement of a court exercising probate jurisdiction to be
 - o Totally mentally incapacitated, or
 - o Partially mentally incapacitated without the right to vote.
