For each polling place in the county, the county shall also post the address including name of the building, and the days and hours of voting at each location.

	Basic information about the political subdivision must be posted on the entity's website including 1) name of members of governing body, 2) contact information for each member of governing body if different than taxing unit's contact information, 3) mailing address, email address, and phone number of the taxing unit, 4) date and location of next officer election, 5) the requirements and deadline for filing for candidacy of each elected office of the political subdivision, which must be continuously posted for at least one year before election day for the office.

	For an office filled by voters of a single county, if the deadline for filing applications for a place on the general primary ballot is extended, not later than 24 hours after a candidate withdraws or is declared ineligible or after the authority preparing the notice learns of the candidate's death, the authority shall deliver a copy of the notice to the county clerk/elections administrator. The county clerk/elections administrator shall post notice of the extended filing period on the county website.

The schedule shall be posted continuously for a period beginning not later than the fifth day before the first day of early voting by personal appearance and ending on the last day of that period. Amendments to the schedule must be made not later than the fifth day before voting is scheduled to begin at the additional temporary branch.

	The following notice regarding the priority given at the polling place to persons with mobility problems must be posted on each Internet website relating to elections maintained by the county:					
	<i>"Pursuant to Section 63.0015, Election Code, an election officer shall give voting order priority to individuals with a mobility problem that substantially impairs the person's ability to move around. A person assisting an individual with a mobility problem may also, at the individual's request, be given voting order priority. Disabilities and conditions that may qualify you for voting order priority include paralysis, lung disease, the use of portable oxygen, cardiac deficiency, severe limitation in the ability to walk due to arthritic, neurological, or orthopedic condition, wheelchair confinement, arthritis, foot disorder, the inability to walk 200 feet without stopping to rest, or use of a brace, cane, crutch, or other assistive device."</i>					
	All procedures and accommodations available to voters with disabilities shall be posted in an accessible manner on the county clerk's Internet website.

	The general custodian of election records in a county with a population of 100,000 or more shall implement a video surveillance system that retains a record of all areas containing voted ballots from the time the ballots are delivered to the central counting station, signature verification committee, or early voting ballot board until the canvass of precinct election returns. The video shall be made available to the public by a livestream.

The forms shall be posted on a website maintained by the county along with election returns and results.

	A county that holds or provides election services for an election, or a city or independent school district that holds an election shall post on its Internet website: the results of each election; the total number of votes cast; the total number of votes cast for each candidate or for or against each measure; the total number of votes cast by personal appearance on election day; the total number of votes cast by personal appearance or mail during the early voting period; and the total number of counted and uncounted provisional ballots cast. The information must be posted as soon as practicable after the election and must be accessible without having to make more than two selections or view more than two network locations after accessing the Internet website home page of the county.
